

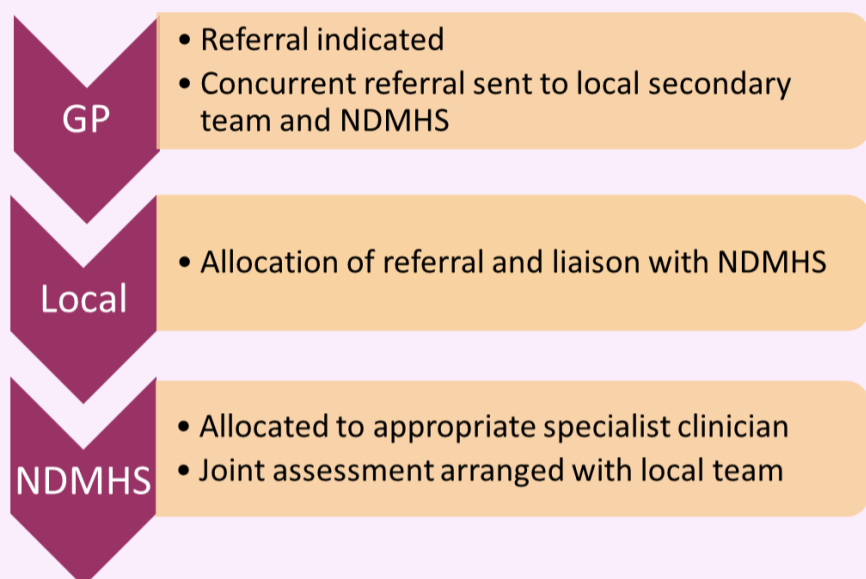


National Deaf Mental Health Service, Birmingham (NDMHS)

- Wales, Northern Ireland and Ireland require funding application

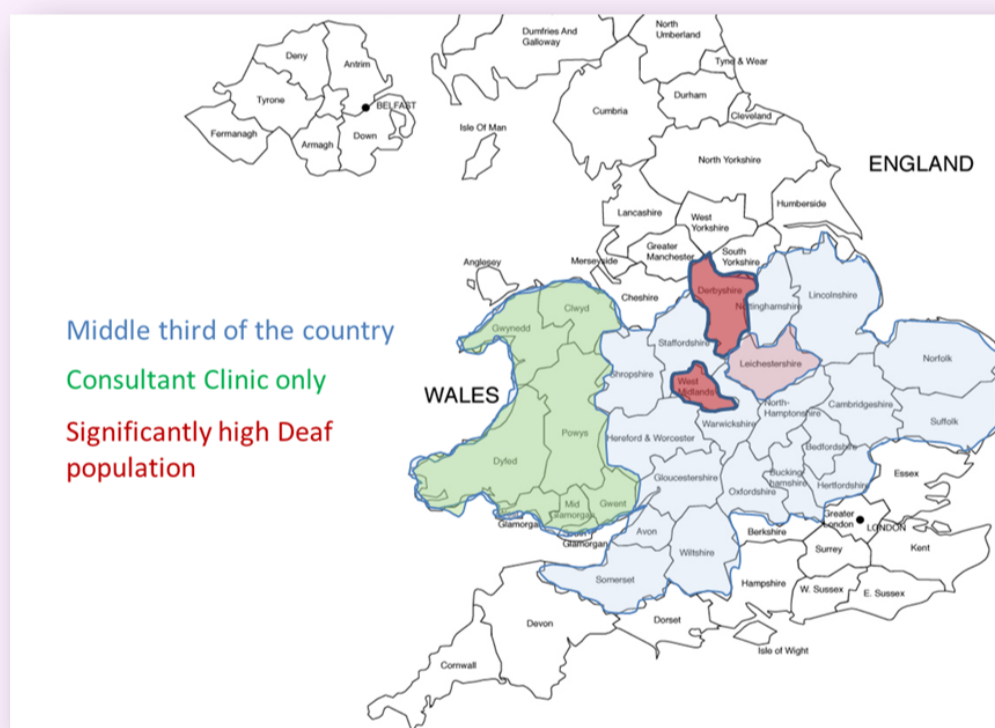
WHAT WE PROVIDE

- Advice/support/signposting
- Joint working
- Bespoke education packages
- Individual/Group work
- Psychological therapies
- Occupational Therapy input

- Local Care Co-ordination
- Interpreting
- Emergency response
- Out of hours

GEOGRAPHICAL AREA



A culturally, ergonomically and linguistically appropriate service to deaf and deaf/blind people with a range of complex needs.

This may be provided within the community, the day service facility or, as deemed necessary, the inpatient unit.
